Holland Code Personality Profiler

These career interest surveys focus on interests so that students can find more direction in their career exploration. Below is the RAISEC interest diagram. Ideally, students will find that the interests that they manifest are close to each other on the diagram. The diagram is divided into occupational themes. Most people are a combination of scales (areas). That combination makes up the Holland Code.

- R- Realistic (hands-on/outdoors)
- A- Artistic (creative)
- I- Investigative/Analytical Thinkers (likes data analysis and detail/research)
- S- Social (helpers)
- E- Enterprising (persuaders)
- C- Conventional (organizers)
