

## Implementation Plan Review Criteria

### 1. Consistency with ballot language

- A. Is the proposed project consistent with the ballot language?
- B. Is the proposed project being shared with the community?

### 2. Equity

- A. Do the proposed projects achieve equity amongst school sites in accordance with district standards?
- B. Do District level projects provide equity to student populations in accordance with district standards?

### 3. Cost Considerations

- A. Do expenditure of bond funds result in operational savings? Does the benefit justify the cost?
- B. Can his project leverage other funding? (e.g. Deferred Maintenance, State Modernization funding)
- C. Is this project supplemental to Measure C work rather than replacing Measure C work?
- D. Have cost savings and cost/benefit measures been considered? (professional fees, site preparation, joint use of core facilities, efficiencies of school design and reusable facility plans?)
- E. Could/should expenditures in year 2004-2005 be made at a site that may become a candidate for school closure? Are these expenditures justified?

**4. Measurability**

- A. Does the project result in an observable outcome?
- B. If there is something unique about the project that could inhibit observation, is there another means of verifying completion?
- C. Is there an observable process that lends itself to oversight?

**5. Conformance**

- A. Is the expenditure in conformance with Department of the State Architect regulations?
- B. Does the expenditure reflect California Department of Education recommendations and guidelines?
- C. Does any legal constraint on the project exist?
