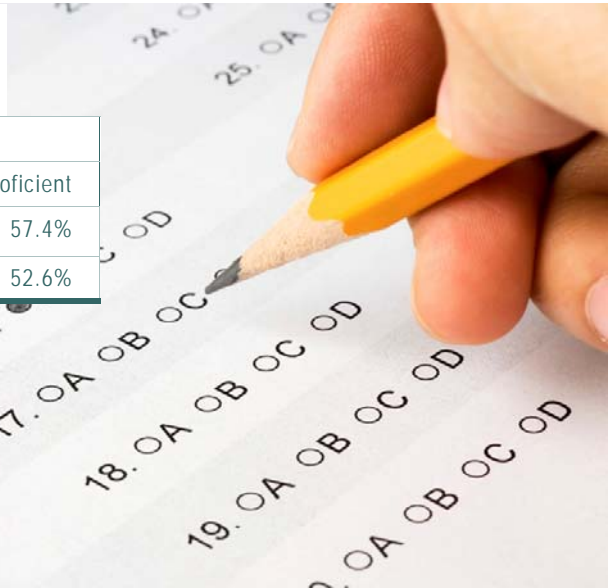
Facilities

Results of a facility inspection conducted on 9/11/09 rated this school's condition as **GOOD.**

The student body and staff take pride in the school and maintain a safe and clean learning environment. The campus has recently been renovated with new windows, restrooms, and sports fields. A state-of-the-art science wing was built and opened for instruction in the fall of 2008. And

construction began in August 2009 on a new 14,000 sq ft, \$6 million high-tech building that will house the Project Lead the Way Pathway to Engineering program.

After entering PI, schools and districts advance to the next level of intervention with each additional year that they do not make AYP.
