

**WILLOW GLEN MIDDLE SCHOOL
UNIFORM POLICY
2006-2007**

Willow Glen Middle School Uniform Policy is as follows:

All students must come to school each day in the basic school uniform. Clothing must be size appropriate. Parents of any student not in proper uniform will be called and student will face disciplinary action. There are no exceptions to the uniform policy.

The basic school uniform:

- **PANTS or SHORTS:** Merry Mart or Dickie style dark TAN or Khaki color pants only. Available at Merry Mart, K Mart or Target. Shorts no more than 4 inches above knee. Capri pant length and/or cream or off-white color pants/shorts not allowed. Baggy, saggy pants that slide past the hips or expose one's undergarments not permitted.
- **SKIRT:** Plaid #1886B at Merry Mart; hemline no more than 4 inches above the knee.
- **POLO SHIRT:** Standard school uniform polo shirt with 2 or 3 buttons only. Solid white or forest green only, with or without school logo. Shirt must not go below middle of pants pocket.
- **SHOES/SANDALS:** Shoes must be worn at all times. Sandals must have back straps. **No red, blue, maroon or pink.**
- **Rules for additional clothing and accessories:**
- **T-SHIRTS/THERMALS:** White, black, gray or forest green only - must be tucked in under polo shirt.
- **JACKETS/SWEATSHIRTS:** No red, blue, light blue, maroon or pink. No logos allowed.
- **BACKPACKS/ACCESSORIES:** No red, blue, light blue, maroon or pink.
- **HATS/HEAD COVERINGS:** Not allowed.

Administration is responsible for the final determination whether clothing and/or accessories are in accord with the uniform policy and may hold onto unacceptable

apparel until loaner is returned. Teachers may refer a student to the office if they feel apparel is in violation of school or district policy.
